15 CHAIRMAN: Well, good morning. This is a hearing of the New  
16 Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board to consider an  
17 application by the Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan for  
18 a permit to construct additional pipelines at McCully  
19 Field.

20 Today's hearing has been established as a pre-hearing  
21 conference. The panel for today's hearing consist of  
22 Steve Toner, Robert Radford and myself as the Chair.

23 Could I have the appearances, please?

24 MR. ZED: Yes, Mr. Chair. It's Peter Zed appearing on  
25 behalf of the applicant. And I am joined at this table by  
Mark Fracchia, who is the general manager of the mine in  
Sussex. And I guess George Bolman, who is the project

2 manager. And we are pleased to be joined today by the  
3 president of PCS Potash, Mr. Garth Moore, who is at the  
4 back of the room.

5 CHAIRMAN: Thank you. For the EUB?

6 MS. DESMOND: Ellen Desmond, Mr. Chair. And with me is Dave  
7 Young and Todd McQuinn.

8 CHAIRMAN: Thank you. And who are the individuals behind  
9 you there? Are they with you or - -

10 MR. ROBERTS: My name is Steve Roberts. I am with  
11 Department of Energy.

12 CHAIRMAN: Oh, yes.

13 MR. ROBERTS: And we would just have informal status here.  
14 We had some interest in monitoring the proceeding.

15 CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

16 MS. BLACKADAR: Janet Blackadar with AMEC Environmental  
17 responsible for the environment assessment for this  
18 project.

19 CHAIRMAN: Thank you very much. I understand that nobody  
20 has pre-registered as an Intervenor. And that's really  
21 why I want to know who is in the room, so that -- in  
22 capacity as an Intervenor.

23 MR. ZED: We have not been served any notices. And have not  
24 been contacted by anybody indicating they wish to  
25 intervene.

1  
2 CHAIRMAN: Perhaps then before we proceed any further, we  
3 might mark some documents as exhibits. And do you have  
4 any affidavits with respect to publication and service of  
5 notice?

6 MR. ZED: I have -- the first item I have is an affidavit of  
7 service, and it is with respect to the requirements of  
8 Section 6 of the Act. And the second affidavit is the  
9 affidavit of Debra Conway of our office, which really goes  
10 to the requirements of the Board Order.

11 CHAIRMAN: Thank you. Perhaps give it to the Secretary.  
12 Just the one copy there, Mr. Zed?

13 MR. ZED: I have one -- an original of each.

14 CHAIRMAN: Thank you. So the initial affidavit -- perhaps,  
15 that was the affidavit of service? Look at them here and  
16 we will mark them.

17 MR. ZED: Yes, there is a requirement, Mr. Chair, under  
18 Section 6 of the Act that the application -- or the  
19 application of filed copies of the application in the  
20 information material required to accompany the application  
21 with various Ministries.

22 CHAIRMAN: Correct.

23 MR. ZED: And Margaret McKay's affidavit attests to the  
24 filing with those departments. And then Debra Conway's  
25 affidavit goes to the requirements set out in the Board's

1  
2 Order that they have been complied with.

3 CHAIRMAN: Thank you. Margaret McKay's affidavit then will  
4 become exhibit A-1. And I am just taking a quick run  
5 through here. It appears that you have served all the  
6 departments that are required under Section 6.

7 Debra Conway's affidavit will become exhibit A-2.

8 Thank you. Now there has been some pre-filed evidence. I  
9 have a binder which contains a letter from you Mr. Zed and  
10 a number of tabs and appendices. And perhaps the  
11 expedient way to deal with this might be to just give that  
12 entire binder one exhibit number.

13 MR. ZED: That would be fine.

14 CHAIRMAN: I would propose to make that exhibit A-3. And  
15 that would be the application from PCS with the supporting  
16 documentation.

17 Mr. Zed, anything else that requires to be marked as  
18 an exhibit at this point in time?

19 MR. ZED: No, Mr. Chair.

20 CHAIRMAN: Now before we proceed any further, I just want to  
21 bring up an issue relating to insurance. The Board has  
22 been provided with a certificate of insurance. And  
23 perhaps in fact we should mark that as exhibit A-4 now  
24 that I think of it. So we will make that A-4.

25 MR. ZED: Is that -- I sent one most recently yesterday

1  
2 afternoon with the change of name. Is that the one?

3 CHAIRMAN: Yes, that's the one I am referring to. It's the  
4 one the Board received late yesterday afternoon. And  
5 essentially it changes the certificate holder from the  
6 Public Utilities Board to the New Brunswick Energy and  
7 Utilities Board.

8 MR. ZED: Yes.

9 CHAIRMAN: The Board has a little bit of concern however  
10 with the notice of cancellation. And notes that Marsh has  
11 in fact provided a certificate of insurance in similar  
12 circumstances where the notice of cancellation has a  
13 slightly different wording. And what we will require in  
14 that notice of cancellation is that it be worded as  
15 follows, should any of policies described herein be  
16 cancelled before the expiration date hereof, the insurers  
17 reporting coverage will mail 60 days written notice to the  
18 certificate holder named herein.

19 So essentially what's changing there is the 30 days  
20 would go to 60 days. The word, endeavour would be  
21 deleted, as would all the words after the word, herein.

22 I can tell you that Marsh has provided a certificate  
23 of insurance for others that contains that wording.

24 MR. ZED: Board counsel has just provided me with a copy of  
25 one of the other certificates. And so since we deal with

1  
2 Marsh I don't suppose that is a problem. Can you just  
3 give me a second?

4 CHAIRMAN: Sure.

5 MR. ZED: We will provide the change by way of amendment.

6 CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Zed. Now as there are no  
7 Intervenors present and that nobody has indicated a desire  
8 to intervene, do you have a motion with respect to today's  
9 hearing?

10 MR. ZED: Yes, sir. I would like to make a motion that this  
11 pre-hearing be actually converted to a hearing and we deal  
12 with the substance of the application today.

13 CHAIRMAN: And that motion will be granted.

14 MR. ZED: So I will ask you to proceed. What I propose to  
15 do is I can either swear a panel or one of the individuals  
16 to affirm the evidence. I don't know if there is -- are  
17 there going to be questions? Would you prefer I --

18 CHAIRMAN: Perhaps you could swear -- one witness is  
19 probably sufficient.

20 MR. ZED: Mr. Bolman.

21 GEORGE BOLMAN, having been duly sworn, testified as follows:

22 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ZED:

23 Q.1 - Could you please state your name?

24 A. My name is George Bolman.

25 Q.2 - And what is your connection with the applicant, Potash

2 Corporation? You are an employee?

3 A. I am an employee. Senior project engineer.

4 Q.3 - You are senior project engineer. And as such are you  
5 familiar with the application that has been marked as  
6 exhibit A-3?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q.4 - And was that application prepared under your direction  
9 and on behalf of the applicant?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q.5 - And do the facts set out in the application remain true  
12 as of this date?

13 A. Yes, they do.

14 Q.6 - Are there any amendments to this application that are  
15 not contained herein?

16 A. No.

17 MR. ZED: Nothing further.

18 CHAIRMAN: Ms. Desmond, any questions?

19 MS. DESMOND: No questions, Mr. Chair.

20 CHAIRMAN: I do have one question, but it will take me a  
21 moment to find it. Mr. Zed, perhaps you could point me to  
22 where I might find the letter from Mr. McQuinn, the  
23 Director of Pipeline Safety, which sets out the draft  
24 conditions. I do have a copy of it. I just don't know  
25 where it is in exhibit 3.

1  
2 MR. ZED: Actually it may not be there, because I think it  
3 was filed contemporaneously with Mr. McQuinn's letter.  
4 What happened is Mr. McQuinn sent a letter to the Board,  
5 sent us a copy of it and we filed the application. So it  
6 may be -- it may well be that it's separately addressed to  
7 the Board and we should probably mark that as an exhibit  
8 as well.

9 CHAIRMAN: All right. So that will become exhibit A-5. And  
10 I will ask the witness, do you have a copy of what we just  
11 marked as A-5?

12 A. Yes, I do.

13 CHAIRMAN: And you have had an opportunity to look at those  
14 conditions?

15 A. Yes.

16 CHAIRMAN: And do you have any difficulty with any of them?  
17 Is the company prepared to adhere to all of the conditions  
18 set forth in that letter?

19 A. Yes. PCS has no problem with any of these conditions.

20 CHAIRMAN: I don't have any further questions. Mr. Toner?  
21 Mr. Radford? All right. The Board will take a short  
22 adjournment.

23 (Recess: 9:45 a.m to 10:10 a.m.)

24 CHAIRMAN: I will now read the Board's decision with respect  
25 to this matter. And it will be followed by a written

1  
2 decision. So in the event that there is some discrepancy  
3 between what I say today and the written decision, the  
4 written decision will govern.

5 Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan Inc., which I will  
6 refer to as the applicant or PCS applied to the New  
7 Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board for a permit to  
8 construct additional pipelines at McCully Field.

9 In conjunction with the application, the Public  
10 Information Program has been filed and was approved by the  
11 Board on August 22nd 2007. Open house sessions were held  
12 on September 13th 2007. A pre-hearing conference was  
13 scheduled for Saint John, New Brunswick on November 28th  
14 2007. Notice of this pre-hearing conference had been  
15 published pursuant to the Board Order of October 30th  
16 2007. There were no filings of intervention in this  
17 matter prior to the pre-hearing conference, nor did any  
18 parties attend the pre-hearing in opposition to the  
19 application for a permit to construct a pipeline.

20 During the course of the pre-hearing conference, the  
21 applicant made a motion that the Board move from the pre-  
22 hearing conference to the hearing of the application and  
23 requested that a permit to construct be issued  
24 immediately.

25 The applicant's motion is based on the following

1 factors. No one has indicated an intention to intervene  
2 formally or otherwise. No Intervenors appeared at the  
3 hearing in opposition to the application. PCS has met all  
4 technical and environmental requirements for work to be  
5 carried out with respect to the application and nothing  
6 further in the regard remains to be done.

7 The Board has considered the motion from the applicant  
8 for a permit to construct the pipelines and has determined  
9 that a permit to construct as requested will be issued  
10 forthwith, subject to the 19 conditions contained in the  
11 Pipeline Coordinating Committee's report to the New  
12 Brunswick Energy Utilities Board dated October 25th 2007.

13 PCS will also be required to amend the insurance  
14 policy as indicated earlier during the hearing.

15 So that is the Board's decision in this matter. And  
16 as I have indicated a written decision will follow.

17 Anything further, Mr. Zed?

18 MR. ZED: No, thank you, Mr. Chair, Members of the Board.

19 CHAIRMAN: Thank you.

20 (Adjourned)
